RESIDENT SERVICES COUNCIL (RSC) UPDATE

Some exciting programs are upcoming to the Manor, thanks to the efforts of President Sheri Wright

In August or September, date to be determined, there will a class on Falling, which will be helpful to Residents. As people age in place, and health issues arise over time, chances of falling increase and this class will help teach residents how to cope and what to do to help prevent falling.

Excerpts from the catalog from the Center for Successful Aging are being compiled for Residents who might need assistance with drug costs and housing rent assistance, among others services and support mechanisms available to seniors in Santa Barbara County. Residents will be notified when it is done.

Mediation sessions/classes led by experts from UCSB will begin in late August. The goal of having these Professors and Grad Students speak to us is to help empower Residents with effective coping mechanisms, co-habiting skills and proven conflict resolution methodologies that are essential to those living in any large congregate living situation, such as the Manor. — Details will follow.


